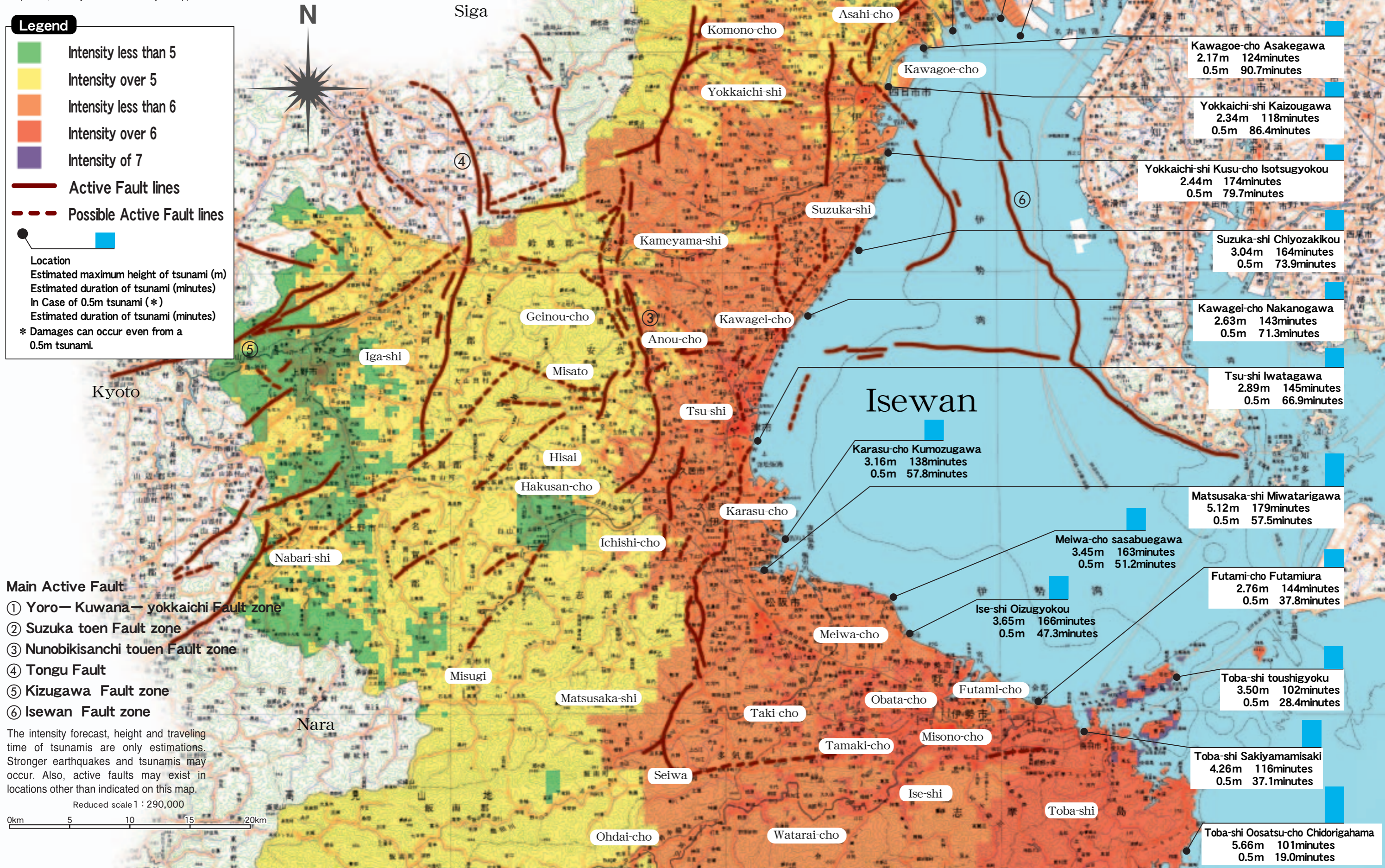

Is everybody all right?

3 Hours

- Be on the lookout for aftershocks
- Join forces with your neighbors to rescue those in need
- Stay clear of concrete block walls and rubble news
- Watch out for downed electric lines and/or gas line leaks

Work within your means, do not over exert yourself.

3 Days

- Use your own food and water
- Gather disaster information
- Place a note on your front door stating where you are
- Do not enter into collapsed structures
- Give and take -- help when possible

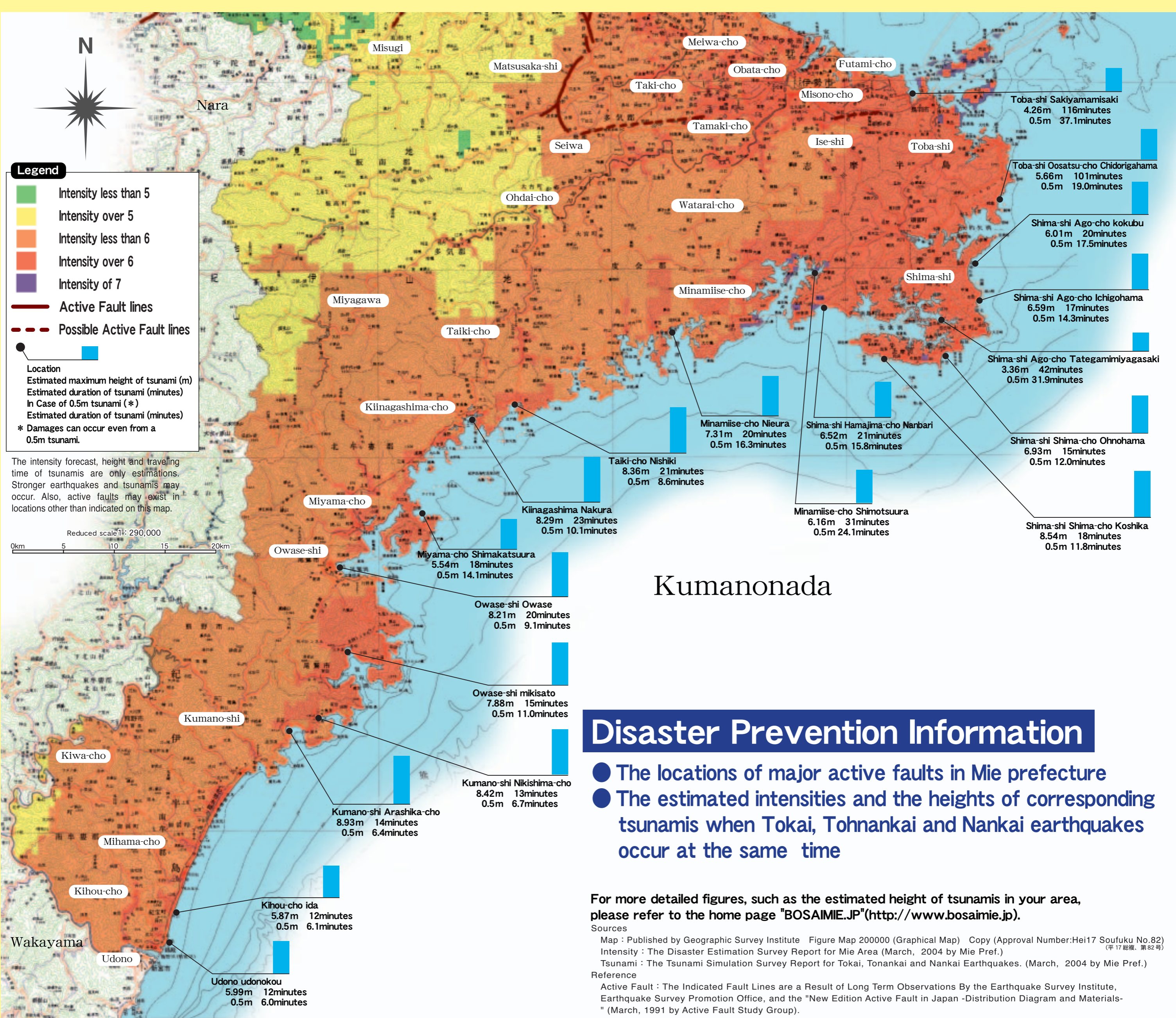
